PETITION TO PARTICIPATE OF THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF COMPOSERS, AUTHORS AND PUBLISHERS

The American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers ("ASCAP"), hereby files this petition to participate in the proceeding to determine the reasonable rates and terms for use of certain works in connection with public broadcasting, in accordance with the Copyright Royalty Board's Notice of December 29, 2015, 81 Fed Reg. 256 (January 5, 2016).

ASCAP is this nation's first and largest performing rights organization ("PRO"), with over 550,000 writer and publisher members and a repertory of millions of copyrighted musical works. On behalf of its members, ASCAP licenses the nondramatic public performance rights in musical works to a wide range of users, including noncommercial public television and radio broadcasters. ASCAP represents not only U.S. writers and publishers, but also hundreds of thousands of foreign writers and publishers through affiliation agreements with PROs in over 95 countries, by which the foreign repertories are licensed in the U.S., and the foreign PROs license the ASCAP represents not only in their countries.

As a result of ASCAP's licensing activities with public broadcasting entities that perform works represented by ASCAP, ASCAP has had a significant interest in, and has been a party to, every 17 U.S.C. §118 proceeding since the inception of the Section 118 license. Likewise, here, ASCAP maintains a significant interest in determining reasonable rates and terms for its licenses with public broadcasting entities and intends to fully participate in this Section 118 public broadcasting rate proceeding on behalf of its members and the members of its foreign affiliated societies.

Notwithstanding this petition to participate, ASCAP remains hopeful that it will be able to reach a voluntary settlement agreement of rates and terms of the Section 118 license.
